


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A MESSAGE FROM THE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

In today's multi-national jazz world, we find superb, well-educated, talented creative jazz musicians in abundance well beyond any other era in modern times. For 29 festival seasons it's been my life's quest to find great music to share with you. As a cofounder and the only artistic director in the festival's history, I'm honoured and humbled by the opportunity to introduce so many of the world's significant improvising musicians to Vancouver audiences.

Our engaging, provocative programs have attained

international recognition – many pundits recognize this festival to be among the most consistent visionary jazz events in the world. Vital and vibrant, our festival continues to portray the global diversity of iazz. improvised music and its genre bending relatives.

This year as a special treat we welcome the legendary Bobby McFerrin to the Orpheum Theatre for the first time since our inaugural 1986 festival. Modern jazz legends at the Vogue Theatre include the masterful Charles Lloyd with his quartet, the multiple Grammy Award-winning Cuban trumpeter Arturo Sandoval, and one of our favourite singers ever, the breathtaking Cassandra Wilson makes a rare appearance. Adding to the sparkle is Vancouver's own chanteuse Jill Barber; the astonishing Japanese pianist Hiromi, and some gritty funk with the inimitable Maceo Parker and Medeski Scofield Martin & Wood.

The lineup at Performance Works this year is rock solid! Kicking the series off is an impressive double bill – John Korsrud's Hard Rubber Orchestra and Darcy James Argue's Secret Society. A native Vancouverite (residing in Brooklyn), the excitement surrounding JUNO and Grammy-nominated Darcy James Argue is palpable. He's now performing at international festivals and is one of the most

formidable composer/arranger/large ensemble leaders in modern music. Armenian pianist Tigran and American trumpeter Ambrose Akinmusire are two younger artists that have created a huge buzz on the international jazz scene.

Our multi-tiered Innovation Series (Ironworks, Roundhouse) advances the notion that great jazz and cutting-edge creative music can be found all over the globe (Norway, Japan, Chile, UK, USA, Denmark, Germany, Sweden, Cuba) and across Canada as well as right here in Vancouver. The Downtown Jazz and David Lam Park Jazz Weekends take it to another level this year. Tons of great jazz and world music make these two weekends essential for any music fan.

We're psyched about the third edition of both Spotlight on French Jazz (Baptiste Trotignon / Mark Turner and Michel Edelin) and Made in the UK (don't miss Norma Winstone). We'll also welcome two Swedish artists as part of a new residence program for all of June — pianist Lisa Ullen and trombonist Mats Aleklint. Our long time partnership with North Shore Jazz continues and we'd also like to acknowledge Hard Rubber Orchestra, Barking Sphinx, International Institute for Critical Studies in Improvisation and VIVO Media Arts for their support in some exciting programming initiatives.

Please check out our impressive education programs in this guide – High School Jazz Intensive with Chicago's Tomeka Reid, an unconventional colloquium: Improvising Across Boundaries, a new outreach project at Downtown Jazz: Tonal Interactive Media Experiment (TIME), and more.

This year's festival is dedicated to Carl Chinn; a true lover of jazz music; a long time arts worker loved by many, a man that I was honoured to work alongside for over twenty years.

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

Coastal Jazz will host a two-day colloquium on Saturday June 21 & Sunday June 22, 2014, focused on the theme of improvising across boundaries. Presentations by members of the artistic and scholarly communities will focus around the ways in which improvisation — in music, in theatre, in dance and text — can offer strategies and practices to help us negotiate boundaries and borders, with the challenges presented by the politics of gender, history and social class or by multiculturalism, by race and racism.

How can improvisation provide performers and audiences with the means to encounter and to come to terms with the ways in which we have undertaken various practices of inclusion and of exclusion, of community-building and of confrontation? Can improvisation enable new modes of cultural and social understanding?

He leads a group of dynamic young lions that animate the stage with what the New York Times calls "limber straight-ahead jazz with mystery and pop instincts." A nine-time Grammy Award winner who also boasts Billboard Awards, an Emmy, and a US Presidential Medal of Freedom, *trumpeter* Arturo Sandoval helped revolutionize Cuban music in the 1970s as a member of Irakere. Mentored by the great Dizzy Gillespie, Sandoval is a "blazing, technically flawless trumpeter [with a] supercharged tone" (*All Music*), whose unabashed love of jazz bursts forth in bebop and Cuban styles topped with dynamic trumpet fireworks. He's lent his delightfully boisterous playing to the likes of Herbie Hancock, Gloria Estefan, and the London Symphony Orchestra.
