Coastal Jazz Unveils Free Jazz Around Town and a New Emcee Competition for the Vancouver International Jazz Festival

(Vancouver, BC) – Coastal Jazz & Blues Society is pleased to announce free programming for the Vancouver International Jazz Festival, including 20 Downtown Jazz shows outside the Vancouver Art Gallery in the šxwÅənəq Xwtl'e7énk Square June 24 and June 25 and 25 Granville Island Jazz shows from June 23 to July 2 at Performance Works, Ocean Artworks, and the Revue Stage.

After a full day of shows on Saturday, June 24, Downtown Jazz wraps up with Lido Pimienta's mind-bending voice and live looping, leading a musical journey from traditional Afro-Colombian percussion to global bass and darker avant-garde electronic sounds. Afro-Cuban rockstar vocalist Cimafunk, a Grammy-nominated force known for keeping things fresh and funky, closes Sunday, June 25 with his nine-piece band of Havana all-stars.

Granville Island hosts other Free Jazz Around Town events including the Festival's opening night performance by The Fits + Hayley Wallis and The Bright Futures at Ocean Artworks.

New faces join the Festival's established roster of emcees with the Coastal Jazz Emcee Competition. Three winners will be selected to emcee free shows at the Vancouver International Jazz Festival. Each winner receives a \$250 cash prize, tickets to attend the Jazz Festival and Festival swag. Participants are invited to submit an audition video sharing why they would make a great emcee. The deadline for entry is May 5, 2023. Entry information found here. Auditions are now open.

The 38th edition of the Vancouver International Jazz Festival will offer 140 shows, including more than 50 free performances from June 23 to July 2, 2023. The Festival kicks off with a free Downtown Jazz concert series outside the Vancouver Art Gallery and šxwÅənəq Xwtl'e7énk Square and includes marquee shows at Queen Elizabeth Theatre and Vancouver Playhouse, plus club shows at various downtown venues, and culminates on Canada Day weekend at Granville Island venues including Performance Works, Ocean Artworks and The Revue Stage.
