Coastal Jazz Taps Longtime Partners for Innovative Programming

Historic relationships with the Western Front venue and Poland's Jazztopad Festival bring new compositions and talent to the 40th Vancouver International Jazz Festival

(Vancouver, BC) – Coastal Jazz announces a performance by saxophonist/composer Immanuel Wilkins with the Lutosławski Quartet at the 40th Vancouver International Jazz Festival on Friday, June 20, 2025, at the Western Front, located at 303 E 8th Avenue, Vancouver. Tickets go on sale to the public at <u>coastaljazz.ca</u> on Thursday, April 3. Coastal Jazz is also thrilled to welcome the return of the New Improvisers Studio featuring Susie Ibarra with an open call for young musicians aged 17 to 24.

Immanuel Wilkins' performance marks the Canadian premiere of his new piece written for the Lutosławski Quartet. The composition was commissioned by Jazztopad Festival / National Forum of Music in Wroclaw, Poland, which has premiered works commissioned from famous improvisers for the past 20 years.

"Since the Festival's early days, Coastal Jazz has partnered with organizations around the world to bring international artists to Vancouver for an extended immersion in our community and help to inspire creativity within our scene," said Cole Schmidt and Jeremy Page, Co-Artistic Directors for Coastal Jazz. "For these upcoming events, we are grateful to be partnering, once again, with the Western Front and Wrocław, Poland's Jazztopad Festival / National Forum of Music."

Immanuel Wilkins & Lutosławski Quartet

The music of saxophonist/composer Immanuel Wilkins is filled with empathy and conviction, bonding arcs of melody and lamentation to pluming gestures of space and breath. Listeners were introduced to this riveting sound on Wilkins' acclaimed debut Omega, which was named the #1 Jazz Album of 2020 by *The New York Times*. On his stunning sophomore album, The 7th Hand, the Brooklyn-based, Philadelphia-raised artist's "ocean-deep jazz epics" (*Pitchfork*) explored relationships between presence and nothingness across an hour-long suite.

Founded in 2007, the Lutosławski Quartet is one of Europe's foremost contemporary classical string quartets, specializing in the music of their namesake, Witold Lutosławski, as well as works by Bacewicz, Szymanowski, and the group's own Marcin Markowicz. An ensemble of versatile and open-minded artists, Roksana Kwaśnikowska violin, Marcin Markowicz *violin*, Artur Rozmysłowicz *viola*, and Maciej Młodawski *cello*)-blend contemporary repertoire with gems from classical, Romantic, and jazz music.

New Improvisers Studio

Coastal Jazz and Western Front are also pleased to present the second year of the New Improvisers Studio (NIS), a week-long educational initiative for 10 young musicians aged 17 to 24. The New Improvisers Studio supports collective explorations in musical improvisation through the mentorship of a world-leading improviser and guests from the Vancouver International Jazz Festival.

This year, the NIS will be led by 2025 Coastal Jazz Artist in Residence Susie Ibarra, who will teach workshops on improvisation and field recording related to concepts from her book *Rhythm in Nature: An Ecology of Rhythm*. The program will culminate in a performance open to the public on Saturday, June 28, at the Western Front.

Artists in Residence - Susie Ibarra and Eve Risser

The Coastal Jazz Artists in Residence program was created to spotlight select artists' individual work while allowing them to connect with local talent and dedicated Jazz Festival audiences. Each year, Coastal Jazz invites artists to experience the festival and the city of Vancouver through public talks, collaborations, workshops, and various

outreach activities within our communities. Coastal Jazz welcomes two Artists in Residence this year - Susie Ibarra and Eve Risser.

Susie Ibarra

Susie Ibarra is a Filipinx-American composer, percussionist, and sound artist. Her work encompasses performance, mobile sound-mapping applications, multichannel audio installations, recording, and production. Across her interdisciplinary practice, many of Ibarra's projects are based in cultural and environmental preservation. Her sound research focuses on the stewardship of glaciers and fresh waters, and she has published writing on the ecology of rhythm in the environment.

Eve Risser

Whether venturing solo into the depths of her prepared piano, experimenting with the retro-futuristic sounds of an electric harpsichord, or exploring the expressive potential of a hybrid and modular mini big band, composer and improviser Eve Risser invents as she breathes. The stunning artistic success of her large-ensemble albums White Desert Orchestra (2015) and Red Desert Orchestra (2018) placed her among the most prominent creators on the European scene.

The 40th Anniversary edition of the Vancouver International Jazz Festival will offer 160 events, including the return of Downtown Jazz, a free concert series outside the Vancouver Art Gallery on šxwxənəq Xwtl'e7énk Square, June 21 and 22. Vancouver Playhouse hosts headlining performances by Richard Bona Asante Trio and the Bill Frisell Trio with Thomas Morgan and Rudy Royston. Granville Island will be the hub for festival activity, with afternoon and evening shows scheduled at Performance Works, Ocean Artworks and the Revue Stage, culminating in a slate of pay-what-you-can shows at Ocean Artworks on Canada Day. In addition, downtown patios, clubs, and North Shore venues will feature various live jazz performances throughout the 12 days of the Festival.
