## Vancouver International Jazz Festival Announces 2025 Accessible Admission Pricing as part of Granville Island Jazz Programming

**(Vancouver, BC)** – <u>Coastal Jazz</u> adds 30 more shows to its Granville Island Jazz programming during the 2025 Vancouver International Jazz Festival, from June 20 to July 1, 2025, with 12 days of live music featuring a wide variety of trailblazing local and international artists performing jazz, blues, soul, pop, folk and improvisational music. Admission to these newly launched Granville Island Jazz shows ranges from free to "Pay What You Can" (\$PWYC) to \$15 at the door.

"Pay What You Can" shows are by donation at the door. "Coastal Jazz has always prioritized presenting accessible music programming to our community," explains Nina Horvath, Executive Director.. "As we evolve and adapt to current circumstances, we're offering more shows in a 'Pay What You Can" model. Everyone is always welcome, and no one will be turned away, but this gives those who can support a meaningful way to do so." Cash and credit cards are accepted.

Granville Island will be the hub for Festival activity, with afternoon and evening shows scheduled at Performance Works, Ocean Artworks and the Revue Stage, culminating in a (previously announced) slate of free shows at Ocean Artworks on July 1st. Horvath added, "Granville Island has been a proud partner of the Vancouver International Jazz Festival since the beginning. So much of our past is tied to venues on Granville Island, from historic spots like Isadora's and Bridges, to the early days of Performance Works and more recent places like Ocean Artworks and the Revue Stage."

Vancouver Playhouse hosts headlining performances by the Bill Frisell Trio with Thomas Morgan and Rudy Royston, and Richard Bona Asante Trio. Granville Island will be the hub for Festival activity, with afternoon and evening shows scheduled at Performance Works, Ocean Artworks and the Revue Stage, culminating in a slate of free shows at Ocean Artworks on July 1st. In addition, downtown patios, clubs, and North Shore venues will feature various live jazz performances throughout the 12 days of the Festival.
