

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

Susie Ibarra is a Filipinx-American composer, percussionist, and sound artist. Her work encompasses performance, mobile sound-mapping applications, multichannel audio installations, recording, and production. Across her interdisciplinary practice, many of Ibarra's projects are based in cultural and environmental preservation. Her sound research focuses on the stewardship of glaciers and fresh waters, and she has published

writing on the ecology of rhythm in the environment.

As leader of the 2025 New Improvisers Studio (see more page 17), Susie will teach workshops on improvisation and field recording related to concepts from her book *Rhythm in Nature: An Ecology of Rhythm*. The program will culminate in a performance open to the public on Saturday, June 28, at the Western Front.

# **VANCOUVER YOUTH JAZZ ORCHESTRA**

This program is a unique music residency for Metro Vancouver high school students, co-presented by Coastal Jazz, the Vancouver Jazz Orchestra and Vancouver Community College.

Up to 21 talented teens are selected from an audition process open to students in Grades 8-12 from over 150 schools across the Lower Mainland. Successful participants are invited to cultivate their talents and networks through mentorship by a professional band director and members

of the Vancouver Jazz Orchestra over five weeks of rehearsals in May-June. Some mentors involved in this year's collaboration with the Vancouver Jazz Orchestra (VJO) are Vancouver Youth Jazz Orchestra (VYJO) bandleader (and trumpet mentor) Geeta Das, VJO artistic director James Danderfer, trombone mentor Nebyu Yohannes, sax mentor Ingrid Stitt, and rhythm section mentor Bernie Arai.







### New Improvisers Studio (NIS)

Coastal Jazz and Western Front are pleased to present the second year of the New Improvisers Studio, a weeklong educational initiative for 10 young musicians aged 17 to 24. The New Improvisers Studio supports collective explorations in musical improvisation through the mentorship of a world-leading improviser and invited guests from the Vancouver International Jazz Festival. This year the Studio will be led by 2025 Coastal Jazz Artist in Residence Susie Ibarra, who will be teaching workshops on improvisation and on field recording that relate to concepts from her book "Rhythm in Nature: An Ecology of Rhythm." The program will culminate in a performance open to the public on Saturday, June 28th at the Western Front.






The Vancouver International Jazz
Festival took its maiden voyage
August 19 – 25, 1985. Billed as the first
annual Pacific Jazz and Blues Festival,
the event featured 100 musicians from
BC, Oregon, and Washington state at
clubs and venues around the city.

It was created - and mostly financed - by a small, but passionate, crew led by pals John Orysik, Robert Kerr, and Ken Pickering, along with Deborah Roitberg, who would become a founding board member.

Together they founded the Coastal Jazz and Blues Society. The non-profit organization was born with the intent of providing a 10-day music festival along with a year-long jazz presence.

"The idea was to present year-round concerts, workshops, special initiatives, and co-presentations," explained John Orysik, "culminating in a spectacular annual international jazz jamboree during the summer – a glorious global summit."
































The success of that weeklong event attracted the attention of tobacco giant du Maurier, who immediately signed on as title sponsor. The Festival quickly changed its name and hooked up with Expo86, presenting over 120 performances that June, including legends like Miles Davis, Ornette Coleman, Wynton Marsalis, Tito Puente, Abdullah Ibrahim, Bobby McFerrin, plus the Cedar Walton Trio, Bill Frisell, and Tim Berne.

"We made a statement with this one," Robert Kerr would later say.

#### The Middle Years

Coastal Jazz quickly built a global reputation for adventurous and intelligent programming, with well-deserved credit going to co-founder and artistic director Ken Pickering. Soon, Rainbow Robert would join the programming ranks, later taking the director baton from Ken. Widespread media recognition grew through the 90's. Stories extolled the Festival's visionary programming, collegial atmosphere,




friendly volunteers, cultural inclusivity, and a variety of pioneering achievements that are now trademark staples.


Each year, the calendar offered up recognizable names to bookend smaller, less established acts. Smaller acts frequently became the must-see events of the festival, and often, the next big thing on the music scene. Opening weekend featured the Gastown Jazz Series with two days of free shows. In 1997 the Festival moved the closing weekend's free programming to two outdoor stages in David Lam Park and a newly opened Roundhouse Theatre, a move that proved very popular with Vancouver residents. "The free element has always been part of the festival," said John Orysik. "We wanted people to access this music and not have any obstacles to it. Whether those obstacles were economic or whether they had a stereotypical view of what jazz was."

In the early 2000's, new legislation limiting tobacco advertising meant du Maurier had to step aside as a sponsor of the Festival. TD Canada Trust quickly swooped in with a title sponsorship that debuted in 2004. Soon after, Coastal Jazz expanded its educational programming with the High School Jazz Intensive, a big band showcase of some of Metro Vancouver's best high school musicians.

Over the years, artists and audiences continued to come out in droves. In 2012, opening weekend shifted from its infamous Gastown location to downtown, embracing a bigger footprint in front of the Vancouver Art Gallery, and making it accessible to an even larger audience. Year after year the Festival charged ahead, presenting some of the biggest names in music such as Herbie Hancock, Tony Bennett, Sonny Rollins, Diana Krall, Wynton Marsalis, Lady Gaga, Robert Plant, Macy Gray, Janelle Monáe, and Wayne Shorter.


















When COVID-19 hit in 2020, plans to gather for a Festival were thwarted. In the aftermath, it quickly became clear how much community and access to art means to our collective mental health and wellbeing. The pandemic's effects on arts organizations across Canada have been lasting. More than 25% were forced to close and many, including Coastal Jazz, are still recovering five years later.

## A New Reality

The last few years have been a whirlwind of constant change as economic realities continually challenge funding for arts organizations like Coastal Jazz. Through it all, we've remained committed to our

mission of presenting the best of jazz and improvised music, nurturing artists, and building community.



We've doubled down on relationships with partners near and far to continue giving artists new opportunities to perform, connect with audiences, and collaborate with each other. We've stayed committed to offering free, accessible programming like the Downtown Jazz Weekend, or our brand new, free Bentall Series at Dunsmuir Patio. We've continued our focus on music education, evolving our programs for young and emerging musicians with the New Improvisers Studio and the Vancouver Youth Jazz Orchestra.

Coastal Jazz is ready to step boldly into the future, and redefine what the Vancouver International Jazz Festival can be in the years ahead. It was born from the passion of a small group of people, and its continued success remains in the hands of our community.

Thank you for being a part of our history. Thank you for helping us keep the music alive.







**Richard Bona** is a Grammy-winning musician, one of the most accomplished international *bass* players, composers and multi-instrumentalists.

With his unique sound and vocal gift he is continuously representing his African origins. Bona's new group, Asante Trio, is testament to his philosophy of cultural collaboration.

Joining Bona is *pianist* Jesus Pupo, who pays tribute to the "piano Cubano" style

and its vibrant Afro-Cuban rhythmic and melodic heritage.

Percussionist Harvel Nakundi provides the groove and layered rhythmic complexity inherent to the many styles that influence the group's sound.

In their collective fusion of jazz, Afro-Cuban, and African styles, Asante Trio embodies the transatlantic musical affinities that trace their roots back to the African continent.

This year's headliners are two highly acclaimed musicians who represent the depth and diversity of artist programming that Coastal Jazz is known for – **Richard** Bona is a Grammy-winning bass player, composer and

multi-instrumentalist in jazz and Afropop music; Bill Frisell is a world-class guitarist and composer who has played the Festival numerous times since his first Vancouver International Jazz Festival appearance in 1986.





Called "a sonic encyclopedia" by *American Songwriter*, Lamarr shapes unforgettable live experiences by responding to the vibe of a particular night and drawing readily from the 1960s organ jazz stylings of Jimmy Smith and Baby Face Willette, the snappy soul strut of Booker T. & The M.G.'s and The Meters,

and surprising treats and teases from Motown, Stax Records, the blues, and beyond.

Since 2015, the Trio has released Billboardcharting albums and toured the world to soldout venues, while Lamarr—a self-taught organ virtuoso—was named a Rising Star in the 70th Annual DownBeat Critics Poll (2022).

The spirit of variety and excitement extends to the DLO3 lineup as well. Lamarr rounds out his trio with a shifting crew of top-flight guitarists and drummers who help fuel the energy and sheer un-repeatability of each live performance. It's a heady concoction of beautiful connection and irresistible groove that goes straight to the heart and soul.



#### **Empanadas Ilegales**

Vancouver-based psychedelic cumbia and salsa ensemble Empanadas llegales delivers contagious cumbia rhythms, hypnotic guitar melodies, and experimental salsa trumpet lines to create a Latin surf-rock/free-jazz fusion. Their latest album, Creepy Mambo, pays homage to cumbia cult classics, infusing a vintage vibe with contemporary synth, slinky dub grooves, and feverish percussion departures to create a "delicious, psych-fried take on Latin dance music" (Exclaim!).

With Arnt Arntzen guitar/banjo, Don Ogilvie guitar, and Jennifer Hodge bass, they'll share their joyful take on classic New Orleans jazz, plus stories of how the music made its way to Vancouver.

Eve Risser is among the most prominent creators on the European scene, and her solo prepared piano album *Après un Rève* (on Clean Feed Records) is almost Zen in its organic, dreamlike developments. "There's a sense of open-ended experimentalism to her approach. Like setting a Rube Goldberg machine in motion, if half the machine was unassembled at start, and the project consisted of Risser assembling the rest in front of our eyes" (*Free Jazz Collective*).

You know the old saying "it takes one to know one"? In this case, it takes two to know two, as a pair of long-standing duos connect in empathic, searching, and virtuosic collaboration.

As HELIOTROPE, they tap into global traditions, avant-jazz, western classical, and free improv to create "an interesting form of 'art song', full of melodies that are elegantly pared

Blurring the boundaries of jazz and electronic music, his "hypnotic, wholly new and radically communal" (Pitchfork) 2018 album *Universal Beings*—featuring Shabaka Hutchings, Tomeka Reid, Jeff Parker, and other greats—made 'Best-of' lists in the *New York Times, Billboard, NPR, The Guardian*, and *Pitchfork.* 2021's Deciphering the Message saw him sampling and engaging with the venerable Blue Note Records catalogue. His newest album, *In These Times*, is the triumphant result of a project more than seven years in the making—the album he's been trying to make since he started making records.

A collection of polytemporal compositions inspired as much by broader cultural struggles as it is by McCraven's personal experience as a product of a multinational, working class Chicago musician community, In These Times encompasses all he's lived through, while also pushing the music forward. Stereogum called it "a beautiful, beautiful record...deeper and more lush than anything he's done to date", while Paste Magazine said that "In These Times is like oxygen in the very lungs of jazz, and McCraven's rhythms like its heartbeat."

One of the finest *trumpeters* in jazz today, Marquis Hill's "pan-musical vision recognizes all Black music – jazz, R&B, hip-hop, etc. – as one long continuum" (*The Big Takeover*). By the time he won the 2014 Thelonious Monk competition, the Chicago South Sider's reputation for fluid virtuosity had been firmly established as an in-demand sideman, a member of the Chicago Jazz Orchestra, and a leader with several buzzworthy albums to his credit. Since then, he's topped the *DownBeat* "Rising Star–Trumpet" Critics Poll, toured nonstop with his group Blacktet, and worked with a jazz who's-who that includes Marcus Miller, Dee Dee Bridgewater, Kurt Elling, Joe Lovano, and Makaya McCraven.

Composers Collective: Beyond the Jukebox celebrates the compositions of friends, colleagues, and heroes invited to write with Marquis specifically in mind. "I was thinking about the tradition in jazz where Dexter Gordon would record a Lee Morgan composition, or Freddie Hubbard would record a Wayne Shorter composition," muses Hill. "I started to wonder, 'When did we stop playing each other's music?' MESTIZX is an eclectic and celebratory expression of post-genre, de-colonial latinx music. Bolivian-born singer/multi-instrumentalist lbelisse Guardia Ferragutti and Chicago expat drummer Frank Rosaly's 2024 debut on International Anthem and Nonesuch Records is "visionary music with boundaryless imagination and creativity" (AllMusic) that steers pre-and post-colonial Latin American rhythms into a collision with avant jazz, Chicago post-rock, minimalism, electronica, and folk.

Partners in marriage and art, the Amsterdambased Ferragutti and Rosaly dive into their respective Bolivian, Brazilian, and Puerto Rican roots to create deeply personal meditations on decolonization and the defiant power of ritual and protest. They chose the title MESTIZX — a non-gendered version of the Spanish colonial word for a "mixed person" — to both challenge and embrace the liminality of their identities and artistic practices. Ferragutti's notable collaborators include Alabaster DePlume, jaimie branch, Ab Baars, Eric Boeren, and Mary Oliver, while Rosaly has worked with Fennesz, Jeff Parker, Thurston Moore, Nels Cline, Colin Stetson, and many others.

With Ben Boye on keys, autoharp, and octatrack, James McClure on trumpet and synth, and bassist Nate McBride, MESTIZX's "infectiously kinetic compositions" (The Guardian) are a movement-inducing lifeline of communal, celebratory, soul-baring music.



#### **Nubya Garcia**

Nubya Garcia isn't easy to classify. Sure, the London-born saxophonist, composer and bandleader grew up studying jazz under noted pianist Nikki Yeoh at Camden Music, but listen to albums like 2020's Source and 2024's Odyssey and you'll hear broader creativity shining through: it's jazz, classical, dub, R&B, and whatever else Garcia wants to explore, when and how she wants to explore it.

Source was released to massive critical acclaim, an NPR Tiny Desk Concert, a Pitchfork "Best New Music" review, a Rolling Stone "Album of the Month" mention, and a Mercury Prize nomination. The New York Times called it "a sweeping set of jazz with Afro-Caribbean influences that funnels a life's worth of experiences into an hourlong listen." Calling Garcia's latest release "a veritable quest of a record," Pitchfork raved that "Odyssey isn't just full of ideas; it's full of good ideas-rich, challenging, and inspiring in their largess." It's a majestic feat on which Garcia blends orchestral arrangements with R&B, jazz, broken beat, and dub, resulting in a grand, nuanced record that feels airy and celestial without sacrificing the groove.

Fronting an incandescent quartet, Nubya Garcia is unquestionably "one of the leading lights of the new young London jazz scene" (*Jazzwise*).

Open Thread—the innovative Melbourne-based ensemble of *cellist* Peggy Lee, *saxophonist* Julien Wilson, *guitarist* Theo Carbo, and *drummer/percussionist* Dylan van der Schyff—weaves anthemic melodies, diverse rhythmic structures, and ear-awakening improvised soundscapes into an idiosyncratic collective identity.

The group was sparked by Lee's move from Vancouver to Melbourne in 2023 and her desire to connect with local musicians (in addition to longtime collaborator van der Schyff). This led to a gathering of attuned talents, and a leap into the joyful possibilities of a collective sound that's as challenging as it is rewarding.

With compositions from each member alongside open-eared, emotionally far-ranging improvisations, the group calls equally on deep vocabularies of extended techniques and their playfully experimental love of melody and song forms. They "dabble in discordant soundscapes. But overall, Open Thread conjures a delicate sound world, asking that listeners put aside distractions and give themselves over to these carefully wrought melodies, thronged with strange beauty and otherness." – Rhythms Magazine


