**(Vancouver, BC)** – <u>Coastal Jazz</u> is pleased to present free workshops, artist talks, and additional programming planned throughout downtown and the North Shore during the 2025 Vancouver International Jazz Festival, from June 20 to July 1, 2025.

#### Free Workshops at Tom Lee Music Hall

In association with Tom Lee Music, the Vancouver International Jazz Festival offers five free workshops for jazz fans and musicians to learn firsthand from select local and international performers.

#### **Artist Talks at the Western Front**

The Festival's two Artists in Residence, *pianist* and *composer* Eve Risser and *composer*, *percussionist*, and *sound artist* Susie Ibarra, appear in free artist talks moderated by Vancouver International Jazz Festival performers.

Artist talks are free to the public at 3:30 pm at 303 East 8th Avenue, Vancouver.

# June 25 - Eve Risser, Moderated by Dylan van der Schyff

Whether venturing solo into the depths of her prepared piano, experimenting with the retro-futuristic sounds of an electric harpsichord, or exploring the expressive potential of a hybrid and modular mini big band, composer and improviser Eve Risser invents as she breathes. The stunning artistic success of her large-ensemble albums *White Desert Orchestra* 

(2015) and *Red Desert Orchestra* (2018) placed her among the most prominent creators on the European scene.

### June 26 - Susie Ibarra, Moderated by François Houle

Susie Ibarra is a Filipinx-American *composer*, *percussionist*, and *sound artist*. She is a 2025 Pulitzer Prize in Music winner, recently honoured with the esteemed award "for distinguished musical composition by an American" for *Sky Islands*, her piece about ecosystems and biodiversity. Her work encompasses performance, mobile sound-mapping applications, multichannel audio installations, recording, and production. Across her interdisciplinary practice, many of Ibarra's projects are based in cultural and environmental preservation. Her sound research focuses on the stewardship of glaciers and fresh waters, and she has published writing on the ecology of rhythm in the environment.

#### **North Shore Jazz**

For decades, North Shore Jazz has operated as a "mini-festival" within the Vancouver International Jazz Festival, featuring free and ticketed shows at various venues across North and West Vancouver. This year's lineup includes eight concerts spanning several musical genres.

### **Tyrant Studios**

In partnership with Coastal Jazz, <u>Tyrant Studios</u>, located at 1019 Seymour Street, hosts ten live jazz performances followed by the Festival's signature, late-night, open jazz jams. The historic venue, located above Vancouver's legendary Penthouse Nightclub, has been a frequent haunt for the greats of performing arts history, including Frank Sinatra, Sammy Davis Jr, Duke Ellington, Billie Holiday and Oscar Peterson, dating back to 1947.

All Tyrant Studio shows begin at 9:30 pm and include one set. Afterwards, the headliner becomes host, sharing the stage with visiting Festival artists and local players starting at 11:00 pm. Jam signup begins at 10:45 pm. Admission is \$18 in advance, \$20 at the door. Admission to the jam only is \$10 at the door.

The 40th Anniversary edition of the Vancouver International Jazz Festival will feature 187 events with 50 free shows, including the return of Downtown Jazz, a free concert series outside the Vancouver Art Gallery on šxwÅənəq Xwtl'e7énk Square, June 21 and 22 and a new Bentall Centre Happy Hour Series on the Dunsmuir Patio. Vancouver Playhouse hosts headlining performances by the Bill Frisell Trio with Thomas Morgan and Rudy Royston, and Richard Bona Asante Trio. Granville Island will be the hub for Festival activity, with afternoon and evening shows scheduled at Performance Works, Ocean Artworks and the Revue Stage, culminating in a slate of free shows at Ocean Artworks on July 1st.
